- c) Student Veterans Association Liyah Stewart
 - a. Confirmation Presentation.
 - b. Mission: Help student veterans and dependents connect with one another on campus regarding veteran resources and creating a culture within the local community that promotes veteran success.
 - c. How? Free printing, Veterans' Library in Foy Hall, supplemental resources, providing technology to veterans that cannot afford laptops and tablets, using programs such as Rucksacks to Backpacks to provide school supplies.
 - d. Currently 58 active members.
 - e. Resources are available to veterans and dependents even if they are not a part of the organization.
 - f. 5 Executive Officers, 5 Appointed Officers, committee chairs.
 - g. Accomplishments:
 - i. AWOL Program: Similar to SOS; creates a smaller environment for veterans that are new to campus and transitioning from active duty to student life, giving personalized schedule tours and advice.
 - ii. Student Organization of the Year in 2019.
 - iii. Operation Iron Ruck: Partner with University of Alabama Veteran Resource Center to do a walk from Jordan-Hare Stadium to Tuscaloosa and back to raise awareness for veteran suicide.
 - h. Why? Want to maintain communication between the Student Government Association to bring feedback and partner with others.
 - Barriers for Veterans: non-traditional students, age gap, different mindset, may not have access to as many resources, do not have access under VA Insurance to Medical Clinic.
 - j. Goals of getting veterans able to use the Medical Clinic and to be more inclusive of all students, to continue raising awareness for veteran suicide, and to continue to raise funds for Rucksack to Backpack program.
 - k. Two meetings each month.
 - 1. Would be beneficial to have an academic advisor in each college that caters to those coming off of active duty into college at Auburn.
