Auburn University Polling Location

WHEREAS, “Extension” is one of the three foundational pillars listed on the seal of Auburn University, and an on-campus polling station would encourage civic engagement, inspiring students to further develop the quality of life in the Auburn community through political processes; and,

WHEREAS, This engagement would lay emphasis on important issues facing the city of Auburn, the state of Alabama, and the entirety of the United States of America; and,

WHEREAS, Lee County will fund the setup and operations of the polling station, creating minimal financial burden on Auburn or its students,

WHEREAS, Providing a polling location for students residing on-campus and around the University would alleviate administrative pressure on other established polling locations as the commission draws new voting wards; and,

WHEREAS, In the 2018 midterm election, the Clarion S. College polling location served 16,173 registered voters. Auburn currently has roughly 10,000 students that would be eligible to vote at this station; and,

WHEREAS, The city of Auburn looks forward to both growth and the upcoming presidential election, this location would facilitate the voting process by lessening the crowds at each location; and,

WHEREAS, The Governor of Alabama sits as the President of the Board of Trustees for the University, therefore, students deserve every opportunity to participate in electing that position; and,

WHEREAS, On-campus polling locations have been successfully implemented at several peer institutions of Auburn University across the country such as The University of Alabama, The University of Georgia, The Georgia Institute of Technology, Texas A&M University, Clemson University, The University of Florida, and Virginia Polytechnic Institute and State University among others; and,

WHEREAS, The college community is a place for students to become civically engaged, but they often face practical hurdles that keep them from voting, including, but not limited to, lack of transportation or physical capabilities to travel to nearby polling locations; and,

WHEREAS, The implementation of the polling location does not violate Alabama Section Code 17-9-10 and grants the University the authority to establish a polling location on campus.

Appendix:

1. Safety

- a. Per the code of the Alabama Law including safety, Section 17-13-26 of Alabama Election Code grants power to the Sheriff of the county to be present at the precinct or district, to preserve good order: “The sheriff of each county on the day of such primary election shall be present in person or by deputy at each election precinct or voting district where such elections are held, and shall preserve good order. All duties imposed and powers conferred upon the sheriff in county and district elections by this section are imposed and conferred on the marshal or chief of police in all municipal primary elections.”

2. Cost

- a. The county pays for voting machines per Section 17-7-1 of Alabama Election Code which states: “The county commission or city commission or such other authority as levies the taxes for county or city purposes of any county or city which adopts the use of electronic voting machines, shall, upon the purchase, rental, or lease thereof, provide for payment therefor by the county or city; provided, that bonds or other evidences of indebtedness, payable not later than 15 years from their dates of issuance, may be issued in accordance with the provisions of law relating to the increase of indebtedness of counties or cities, to meet all or any part of the cost of the electronic voting machines.”

3. Demographics

- a. “According to 2017 American Community Survey 1-year estimates, there are 30,374 young adults between the ages of 18 and 24 in Lee County young adults in this age group account for 1 of the Lee County total population.” Lee County Commission. November 14, 2018.
- b. “The number of registered voters at each precinct ranged from 436 at Uptown Waverly to 16,173 at Clarion Inn South College. According to the Auburn University housing website, 4,800 students currently reside on campus, eliminating this concern (see Appendix 5). Further, 14 of Lee County’s 22 polling locations serve fewer registered voters than the number of students that reside on Auburn’s campus (436 at Uptown Waverly to 4,750 at Opelika Learning Center)” Lee County Commission. November 14, 2018.
- c. “In November 2018, during the midterm election, the Clarion S College location served 16,173 registered voters (see Appendix 4). This large service area often results in long lines and wait times and may serve as a deterrent for students with full class schedules and for employees with limited break times. The creation of an on-campus polling location should alleviate the heavy burden at the Clarion Inn, resulting in shorter wait times and more efficient voting experiences.” Lee County Commission. November 14, 2018.

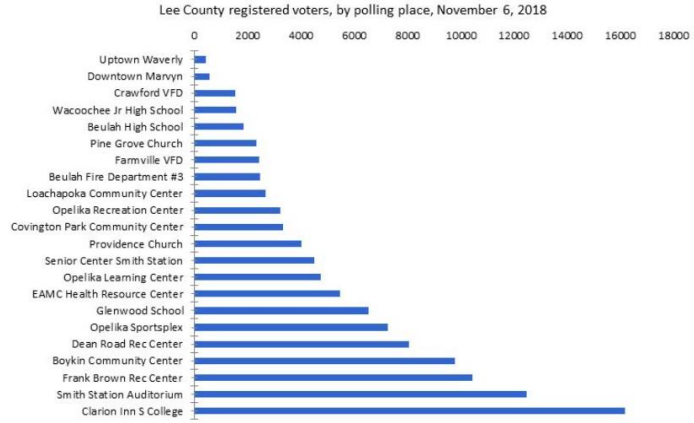


Figure 2. Lee County Registered Voters, by Polling Place, November 6, 2018.
